  - From which countries and how many FTE were from non-local countries.
  - How many FTE were apprentices, trainees or cadets from countries other than 'local', as defined by the Act.
  - What source documents and methodology were used to provide the answers to this question.

- 2482 MR DAVIS** — To ask the Minister for Roads (for the Minister for Transport Infrastructure): In relation to the *High Capacity Metro Train Project Summary – February 2017* and noting that it details a number of project milestones, including the ‘Provisional acceptance of the 1<sup>st</sup> HCMT (commencement of revenue service)’, due by 29 March 2019, which has not occurred:
- (1) What is the revised date for this milestone.
  - (2) What has caused the delay.
  - (3) Has the date for the milestone ‘Provisional acceptance of the Initial Fleet’, due by 2 August 2021 changed, and if so, what is the revised date.
  - (4) Has the date for the milestone ‘Provisional acceptance of the Fleet’, due by 18 July 2023 changed, and if so, what is the revised date.
  - (5) Has the date for the milestone ‘Provisional acceptance of the Project’, due by 18 July 2023 changed, and if so, what is the revised date.
  - (6) Has the date for the milestone ‘Final acceptance of the Fleet’, due by 29 January 2024 changed, and if so, what is the revised date.
  - (7) Has the date for the milestone ‘Maintenance phase’, initially listed as 14 December 2018 to 18 July 2053 changed, and if so, what are the revised dates.
- 2483 MR DAVIS** — To ask the Minister for Roads (for the Minister for Transport Infrastructure): In relation to the High Capacity Metro Train contracts, specifically Schedule 5, Change Compensation Principles:
- (1) How many change notices have been submitted by Project Co., to date.
  - (2) What is the ‘Change Compensation Event’, as defined in Table 1 of Schedule 5, and the date of each change notice.
  - (3) Which change notices were accepted by the State.
  - (4) What is the effect on project milestones or amounts payable by the State, over the life of the contract, of each accepted change notice.
  - (5) How many ‘Modification Orders’ and ‘Modification Requests’ have been issued by the State to date, and what is the date of issue of each ‘Modification Order’ and ‘Modification Request’.
  - (6) What is the technical specification number involved, for example the ROL number, and what is the new specification where a technical specification change has occurred, either by a change requested, or an order/modification initiated by the State, as per PartC1 of Schedule 27.

- 2488 MS PATTEN** — To ask the Minister for Roads (for the Minister for Transport Infrastructure): In relation to the Level Crossing Removal Project (LXRP) in Coburg:
- (1) How many community consultation programs were held.
  - (2) Why were U-trough beams used.
  - (3) Was the use of Super T beams considered for the Project.
  - (4) How many century old signal boxes, similar to the 100-year-old signal box destroyed by the LXRP in Coburg, are left in Victoria.
- 2489 MS PATTEN** — To ask the Minister for Training and Skills (for the Minister for Police and Emergency Services): In relation to the sale of fentanyl on the dark web:
- (1) Is the Government aware that fentanyl is being sold on the dark web from inside Australia and if so, were any sold within Victoria.
  - (2) How many fentanyl parcels have been detected in Victoria.
- 2490 MS PATTEN** — To ask the Minister for Regional Development (for the Minister for Consumer Affairs, Gaming and Liquor Regulation): Who made the decision not to close Crown Casino before 19 March 2020.
- 2491 MS PATTEN** — To ask the Minister for Regional Development (for the Minister for Tourism, Sport and Major Events): What advice was given to the AFL before their decision to start Round 1 of the 2020 season.
- 2492 MS PATTEN** — To ask the Minister for Training and Skills (for the Attorney-General): How does the Government anticipate that the legal needs of Aboriginal Victorians will be met during the COVID-19 pandemic under already strained resources.

- 2493 MS PATTEN** — To ask Minister for Regional Development (for the Minister for Corrections): Has consideration been given to impose a freeze on imprisoning minor offenders and unsentenced persons during the COVID-19 pandemic given the disruption within courts as well as the health risk within prisons.

- (1) What economic considerations does the Government take in to consideration when calculating the economic impact of the duck hunting season.

- (2) Does the Government consider how the hunting season affects bush walking and birdwatching tourism when calculating the economic impact.

**2499 MS PATTEN** — To ask the Minister for Road Safety and the TAC: What is the current status of e-scooter regulations in Victoria.

**2500 MS MAXWELL** — To ask the Minister for Health (for the Minister for Child Protection): In relation to the former Minister for Families and Children's media release dated 6 October 2016 titled 'Breaking New Ground in Foster Care':

- (1) How long did the trial of the 'Treatment Foster Care Oregon' model ultimately run for, and is the Government still continuing to use the model.
- (2) How much funding has the Government allocated in total to the 'Treatment Foster Care Oregon' model.

**2503 MR HAYES** — To ask the Minister for Resources: In relation to the *Victorian Gas Program Progress Report No. 4, March 2020*: Is it correct that gas development will not lead to any significant increase in gas use in Victoria, or bring down gas prices, and if so, why did the Premier's media release of 16 June 2020 titled 'Onshore Conventional Gas Restart A Green Light for Jobs' claiming that lifting the moratorium would create jobs and bolster energy supply.

**2504 MR HAYES** — To ask the Minister for Resources: In relation to the *Victorian Gas Program Progress Report No. 4, March 2020*:

- (1) Is it correct that the best case revenue scenario is that onshore gas development would raise \$31 million per year, equivalent to less than 0.05 per cent of Government revenue.
- (2) Does this represent a reasonable return for allowing industrial development on some of Victoria's best farmland.

- 2505 MR HAYES** — To ask the Minister for Health: In relation to research undertaken by Professor Alon Tal reported in *The Times of Israel* on 25 March 2020: Is the Minister aware of this research which states that overcrowding and population density are factors in a pandemic's reach and is as important to its impact as its pathology.
- 2506 MR HAYES** — To ask the Minister for Health: In relation to findings by Mr Gary Wockner reported in the *Denver Westword* article of 29 March 2020 titled 'To Avoid the Next Coronavirus, Don't Be Dense': Is the Minister aware of these findings which state that it is a basic epidemiological fact that human density increases disease transmission.
- 2507 MR HAYES** — To ask the Minister for Health: In relation to the conclusion by Dr Steven Goodman reported in *The New York Times*' article of 23 March 2020 titled 'Density is New York City's Big "Enemy" in the Coronavirus Fight': Is the Minister aware that New York's coronavirus toll has been much greater than that of Los Angeles because New York is much denser, and that "Density is really an enemy in a situation like this...With large population centres, where people are interacting with more people all the time, that's where it's going to spread the fastest".
- 2508 MR HAYES** — To ask the Minister for Health: In relation to the finding by Dr Peter Daszak reported in the *Scientific American* in 2013: Is the Minister aware of the finding which states that "There's a strong correlation between the risk of pandemic and human population density. We've done the math and we've proved it".
- 2509 MR HAYES** — To ask the Minister for Health: Has the Minister or the Department of Health and Human Services undertaken research into the link between population density and pandemics in general and COVID-19 in particular.
- 2510 MR HAYES** — To ask the Minister for Health: Will the Minister seek to be consulted on planning, infrastructure and other decisions of the Government which could increase Melbourne's population density and hence Victoria's susceptibility to future pandemics.
- 2511 MR GRIMLEY** — To ask the Minister for Health (for the Minister for Prevention of Family Violence): In relation to the Victorian Auditor-General Office's Report, *Managing Support and Safety Hubs*:
- (1) When will cultural training for cultural safety officers be available and mandatory.
  - (2) What technology will be used for supplement reporting and information sharing within the roll-out of future hubs.
  - (3) What is the current process for following up clients that have progressed through the Hub system.
  - (4) What system will be used to monitor engagement within the hubs especially when child safety is concerned.
